If your child has borrowed some items of clothing from nursery, please return items washed as soon as you can. Thank you.

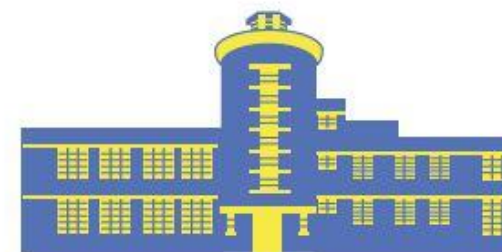

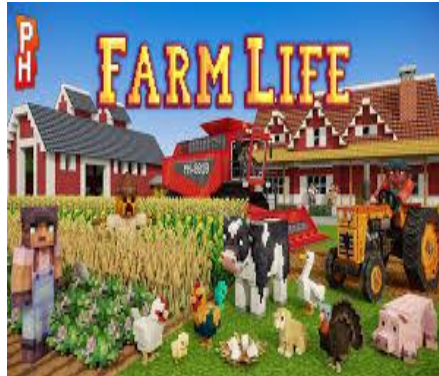

Dear Parents and Nursery children,

Our Key question is 'What animals live on a farm?'

The children will be learning about

- The role of a farmer
- Farm animals
- Baby animals
- Fruit and vegetables that grow on the farm
- Farm House/ Farm shop
- Vets



Nursery homework:

- To taste new vegetables
- To link numerals and amounts of farm animals
- To write some or all of their name
- To use their imagination when playing with their small world toys related to our topic
- To sing songs related to farm animals e.g. Old MacDonald had a farm, 5 little ducks, etc
- Encourage your child to be a 'Phonics Detective': Allow your child to teach a grown up the song Old MacDonald had a farm. What animals will be in your song? What noises do the animals make? Play an animal themed guessing game. Make some sound effects for different animal noises and encourage someone to guess what animal sound you were making. You could 'meow' like a cat or 'woof' like a dog,

Please put your child's work in their home-learning journal, so that they can talk about their achievements at news time.

Events:

- Life base Visit: The children will meet 'Harold the giraffe' puppet, who will talk about keeping fit and healthy.
- The Farm visit: The children will experience the joy of getting close to the farm animals to brush and stroke them.

The Nursery Parent Workshop presentation is on the school's website. 'What my child does in Nursery and why?'
