Education Penalty Notices (fines)

Academic impact: Even small increases in absence can significantly reduce a child's chances of achieving expected academic standards, especially in primary and secondary school.

Social and emotional development: School provides a vital environment for social interaction and well-being, which can be missed through poor attendance.

Long-term life chances: Consistent absence can impact a pupil's future, with research indicating a potential decrease in lifetime earnings for persistently absent pupils.
