

## Year 3 Home Learning tasks for the

### Summer Term

1. Interview someone that lives in the Ruislip area (family member / local resident / family friend). Research what it is like to live in Ruislip by asking questions.
2. Explore land use (housing, woodlands, fields, etc.) in and around Ruislip. Make a map and design a key to match.
3. Create an interesting PowerPoint presentation on Ruislip. Include text, a slide design and pictures.
4. Create a poster to advertise Ruislip as a fabulous place to live. You may even want to take photographs of the local amenities and upload these to your poster to make it more realistic.
5. Pick a tourist destination in London. Research how you could get there on public transport. Write down the journey (instructions) for someone to follow to get to your destination. Don't forget to include approximate timings.
6. Think about your two favourite places in or around Ruislip. Draw a picture or take a photograph of each place and place in your book. Write a description of each place and explain why you like these places so much.
7. Create a list of positives and negatives of living in Ruislip. Which is the longer list? What does this tell you?
8. Create an acrostic poem for RUISLIP
9. If you could meet the Mayor, what three suggestions would you put forward as ways to improve Ruislip? Explain your choice.
10. Picture your local park. If you can add a sculpture at the entrance of park what would it be? Sketch it in your book and explain why you chose this design.
