Getting these important habits established early on in your child's life will make a difference in the future. There is a proven link between attendance and achievement and it is therefore very important that your child attends school every day.

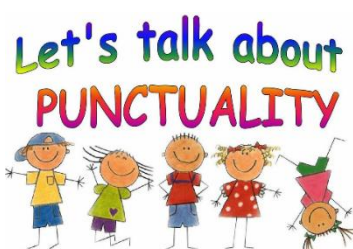
Punctuality
