

## Attendance and Lates April 2026

Missing a day of school here and there may not seem like much,  
but absences add up.

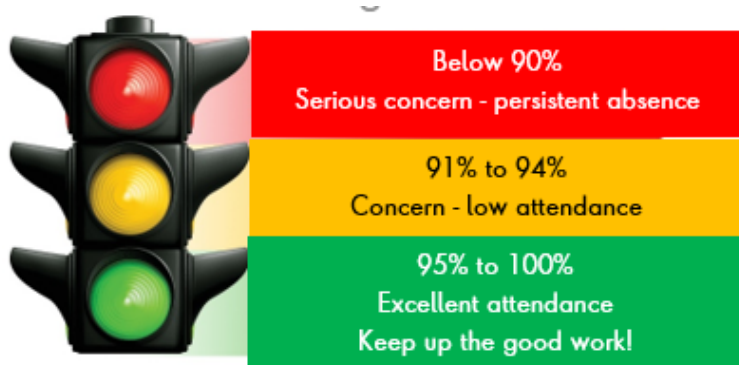
Research shows that pupils with the best attendance also achieve the best results.

### Attendance record and lessons missed

- 95% attendance means 50 missed lessons. This means a child missed about 10 days or 2 weeks of lessons in the school year.
- 90% attendance means 100 missed lessons. This means a child misses 4 weeks of lessons in the school year.

### Punctuality

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year, that's 20 lessons missed.
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to 2 weeks absence a year, that is 55 lessons missed.
